MONDAY JUNE 1, 2020 WHY BEES AND OTHER POLLINATORS ARE SO IMPORTANT

There are more than 20,000 kinds of bees in the world and over 4,00 kinds living in North America. Bees and other insects and animals pollinate 80% of the world's plants and 1/3 of the food we eat. Bees make possible strawberries, watermelons, chocolate, coffee and many more of our favorite foods. **Thanks, bees!** Butterflies, beetles, wasps, hummingbirds, ants and even bats carry pollen from flower to flower. All these pollinators make possible many of the foods we eat.

Bee Waggle Dance:

When a worker bee discovers a good source of nectar or pollen (note the pollen spores dusting this bee's back), she will return to the hive to perform a waggle **dance** to let her nest mates know where it lies. A bee performs the waggle **dance** when she wants to inform other **bees** of a nectar source she has found. See the dance here:
